Call to order & roll call

Meeting called to order by Chairman Allison at 10.20 AM.

President Duffell called the roll: 6 members present, 1 member absent. Mr. Duffell informed the Chairman that a quorum was present.

II. Chairman Allison welcomed and thanked participants for attending and their enthusiasm. Self-introductions were made.

III. Agenda approval

A motion to approve the revised agenda was made by Mr. Price and seconded by Ms. Ambrose. The motion passed 6-1, with 1 member absent.

Ms. Howard presented the County's overall economic priorities, describing where the Research Park at FAU and Global Ventures fit in the overall strategy.

V. Presentation of City of Boca Raton economic development initiatives

Ms. Hernandez presented the City's overall economic priorities, describing where the Research Park at FAU and Global Ventures fit in the overall strategy.

VI. Imperatives of modern research parks, trends in research, science & tech parks

Mr. Darmody presented the trends in research parks, including new uses, new industries and encouraged fresh thinking, engagement and creativity.

VIII. Presentation of FAU College of Engineering and I-SENSE priorities

Dr. Batalama presented the College's existing programs and suggested ways faculty and students could interact more with them.

Dr. Pados described I-SENSE and the Center for Connected Autonomy, suggesting several technologies that are attractive and important to businesses. Discussion ensued around how to engage small teams of larger corporations to locate in the Research Park at FAU.

IX. Presentation of FAU Division of Research priorities

Dr. Flynn described the Division of Research's progress and future goals, discussing the importance of external engagement.

X. Presentation of FAU Health Network priorities

Dr. Pilitsis described FAU Health Network, including its goals to improve the quality and access to healthcare in South Florida. Discussion ensued about how to make sure the Research Park at FAU is the epicenter and physical embodiment of the initiative.

XI. Open discussion of Research Park at FAU priorities 2023-2026

Consensus was quickly reached that the strategic focus should be on the main areas FAU continues to work on in engineering and medicine. Agreement was reached that activating the Park is paramount: bring students and faculty onto the Park. Mr. Duffell to draft ideas to discuss with members individually, as well as with stakeholders and then bring a draft plan to the Authority in October.
